Recorded in a converted New Orleans-area church over six days, *Redemption* is a jambalaya of Chicago blues, New Orleans funk, and robust soul. On the standout "Chariot," Glen David Andrews's voice rises with gritty passion as he trails into the

song's tag, borrowed from the spiritual "Sweet Home Chariot":
